Ahead of us, I see many opportunities, but the most pressing is to develop a Master Plan for the entire parish. The parish and school budgets are in fine shape and therefore the principles of good stewardship demand that with God's help we plan well for the future needs of this thriving community of faith. We will be looking at this from two vital angles; what are the pastoral needs of those in our parish and what facilities do we need to meet those needs? The Pastoral Council did a lot of research into the previous studies concerning facilities and programs. With that history in hand, we are poised to take the next step—to determine what this parish community discerns to be where the Lord is inviting us to proceed.

Some previously identified needs were:

- ⊙ A suitable space dedicated to Youth Ministry
- ⊙ A suitable space dedicated to our vibrant Social Ministry
- ⊙ More seating in our Church
- ⊙ A Chapel for daily Mass, Adoration and small funerals, weddings, etc.
- ⊙ A new Pastoral Center (the oldest building on the property), and,
- ⊙ A Grand Hall, large enough for the parish community to gather.

We need to identify a current list, prioritize it and move forward with the plan we decide upon. These are exciting times when our **Faith** in God will lead us to trust in **Hope** and move forward in **Love** into living more closely the **Mission** God has called us to live!

This past year we...

- ⊙ Welcomed 214 new households to our parish community;
- ⊙ Baptized over 114 infants;
- ⊙ Confirmed 74 teens and adults;
- ⊙ Married 21 couples;
- ⊙ Welcomed 32 adults into our faith; and
- ⊙ 133 children received the Eucharist for the very first time.

- ⊙ Over 150 people were anointed with the oil of the sick and our Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion made 70 visits on average each week to those who could not join the community for Sunday Eucharist.

- ⊙ We walked in solidarity and support for those who were hungry in our community and provided, on an average, food for 62 parish families and 222 community families each week. We directly helped over 1500 families apply for food stamp benefits.

- ⊙ 593 parishioners pledged \$1,443,480 towards our parish goal of \$1,966,348 for the diocesan *All Things Possible* Campaign. 25% of every dollar raised up to the parish goal will be shared with the parish, used for the items identified in the Parish Case statement.

- ⊙ Our parish school provided academic and faith formation to 690 students while our faith formation program for children met the needs of almost 488 children and their families.

- ⊙ Over 1,000 adults nurtured and strengthened their Catholic faith by participating in one or more of the different catechesis/faith formation opportunities offered by our parish.

- ⊙ At the heart of all the activity this past year were over 2,777 individuals who served in more than 100 different roles for our church and school to do the work that we as a community are called to do.
